Asbestos found in Claire's Cosmetics

Action Mesothelioma Day this year was all about Awareness. A few years ago Sarah undertook a project researching where asbestos may be found in 20th Century buildings and products. One of the most surprising outcomes was that talcum powder, processed before, 1970, contained asbestos.

Recently we were horrified to learn that a US analyst confirmed the presence of Tremolite (one of the recognised categories of asbestos) in children's products sold at an outlet of Claire's Accessories in a London suburb.

The Asbestos Support Groups' Forum issued a press release on the 21st May this year about the findings. Previous reports had highlighted contamination of products sold under the Claire's brand in US, Canada and the Netherlands. The Asbestos Victims Support Groups Forum and the International Ban Asbestos Secretariat were naturally concerned about UK products. Therefore, they took measures to purchase samples and send them away for analysis. The samples were purchased on April 8 2018. Careful analysis took place revealing Tremolite (asbestos) in talc based products including Claire's Natural Eye Eyeshadow, blusher, Unicorn powder and other

eyeshadows. **IBAS and the Forum sent out press releases calling for the products to be re-called immediately and demanding health warnings and investigations.**

We have not been informed of any outcome of these warnings.

This is scary, asbestos has been banned since 1999 yet in 2018 it has been revealed that products containing asbestos, aimed at children and teenagers, are being sold on the high street.

Action Mesothelioma Day

Thank you to everyone who joined us on Action Mesothelioma Day and to everyone who has sent sponsorship money. We really appreciate your support. A total of £460.00 was raised for Mesothelioma research and a total of £1,790 for DAST.

On a beautiful sunny morning on Action Mesothelioma Day – 6th July 2018, we met at Grassmoor Country Park to plant our "Tree of Knowledge and



Awareness” – a beautiful apple tree, great for wildlife, especially bees and birds. Speeches about the importance



of raising awareness were delivered by Joanne Gordon and Dave Trigg before those present were invited to place symbols on the tree highlighting some of the main professions where sadly people have been affected by mesothelioma.



A plaque was also placed on the notice board near the tree commemorating the occasion.

Afterwards everyone was invited for a buffet lunch at North Wingfield Community Centre and to see videos; one produced by DAST for Action Mesothelioma Day in 2016 and the other produced by Sarah Nagamatsu dedicated to Japanese victims of Mesothelioma. Sarah is a Lung Cancer Nurse from Japan who attended our Mesothelioma in the Midlands Conference in April this year. She asked the choir “Tenovus” whose lives had been touched in some way by cancer, if they would back a video she was producing in Japan.
